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### CLEANER KIDNEY FOR A STRONGER CITY

MANDALUYONG CITY - In response to the increasing number of cases of kidney failures in the Philippines, the city of Mandaluyong took the initiative to build their own dialysis center. The inaugural blessing of Mandaluyong Dialysis Center was also attended by Mandaluyong City Health Officer (CHO) Dr. Zaldy Carpeso, Nephrology Basics Dialysis Center Inc. Dr. Maria Briones, Mayor Menchie Abalos, Vice Mayor Anthony Suva, and the locals.

A short program was opened by Vice Mayor Suva who acknowledged the presence of everyone who where able to attend the said event and thanked the people who made the dialysis center creation possible. Dr. Briones congratulated the city of Mandaluyong for a noteworthy project which could help and save lives of the people.

Director Flores also delivered her message as she commended this initiative of the city of Mandaluyong. She also assured that the MMCHD will not stop supporting these kinds of projects for it does not only promote healthy lifestyle but it also encourages unity and solidarity among members of the society in saving lives. She also advised everyone to take care of themselves against the increasing risk of diseases such as diabetes and leptospirosis. Dr. Carpeso, on the other hand, gave out a short lecture regarding the symptoms of diabetes and encouraged them to seek advice from a doctor if symptoms persisted.

To end the program, Mayor Abalos gave her closing remarks, as she once again, thanked everyone for the collective efforts they had contributed by making the dialysis center possible. She said that the creation of dialysis center was just a start in promoting healthy and comfortable place for Mandaluyong City.

hrough the years, several facilities, health and non-health, were hand in hand in promoting the practice of breastfeeding thus achieving numerous achievements within the country. One of their achievements was successfully disseminating the information regarding the benefits of exclusive breastmilk to thousands of mothers. To celebrate this along with other hundreds of successful related projects, an Awarding Ceremony for Mother-Baby Friendly Facilities was conducted to recognize fifteen (15) institutions for continually supporting and promoting Breastfeeding in the region at Bulwagang Villegas, Manila City Hall on August 8, 2018.

The ceremony was graced by OIC-Director of the Center for Health and Development (CHD-MM) Dr. Corazon I. Flores, National Director of World Vision Development Foundation Mr. Rommel Fuerte, Director of Justice Jose Abad Santos Medical Center Dr. Merle Sacdalan Faustino, and Physician of Manila Health Department Dr. Gina Pardilla. It was also attended by the representatives of World Vision, health workers, mothers, and breastmilk donors.

For three (3) decades, the MMCHD has been constantly advocating the practice of breastfeeding to improve the health of infants and children in the country. As the Director of MMCHD imparted in the ceremony, "the practice of breastfeeding must be highly encouraged to everyone for this makes infants stronger and healthier". She also said that it improves not only the IQ of a child but also the EQ through the bond being formed between the mother and the baby while being breastfed. In addition to this,

"breastfeeding is much more economical compared to the commercialized formula milk which does not offer nutrition as much as what the breast milk does", added by the OIC-Director.

In accordance with the theme provided in the ceremony, "Breastfeeding Foundation of Life", the MMCHD also led the turnover of breastfeeding equipment and IEC materials to the Manila Health Department. The agency believes that this will help disseminate the proper knowledge to the community regarding the benefits of breastfeeding. Certificates of Recognition were also given to those facilities that advocate breastfeeding.

Through the joint efforts of the city government of Manila City, MMCHD, Manila Health Department, Mother-Baby Friendly Philippines, and World Vision; the Awarding Ceremony for these celebrated facilities was made possible. The MMCHD also assured that the advocacy of breastfeeding will be supported continuously by the agency as it corresponds to its goal – to guarantee optimal health for everyone, especially the poor, through the efficient use of resources.

QUEZON CITY - Enforcement of action plans to eliminate Tuberculosis (TB) is necessary as the said disease remains to be a major health problem in the country. 



The activity was attended by MMCHD Director III Dr. Ma. Paz Corrales and visitors from the ABS Gen Herbs International Corporation, who distributed some of their products to the participants. To conclude the event, Dr. Corrales thanked everyone for their active participation. The lecture was then followed by free consultation offered by the office clinic.

CITY of MANILA - The Department of Health (DOH) reinforced its Nationwide Measles Vaccination Campaign to abate the existing Measles outbreak in Metro Manila and in Central Luzon. The Department held the Outbreak Response Immunization (ORI) meeting at the DOH Central Office on February 15, 2019 to relay measles surveillance data and to refine its plans on how to make the Campaign more efficient.

The meeting was attended by Health Secretary Dr. Francisco Duque III, Assistant Secretaries Dr. Maria Rosario Vergeire and Dr. Elmer Punzalan, Parañaque Mayor Edwin Olivarez, Metro Manila Center for Health Development (MMCHD) OIC-Director IV Dr. Corazon Flores and Director III Dr. Maria Paz Corrales, and City Health Officers (CHOs) of Metro Manila. Several media agencies were also present during the conference.


The meeting was initiated by Asec. Vergeire by presenting the latest number of confirmed measles cases in each region. She attributed the measles outbreak to multiple factors. One major factor discussed was the dramatic drop in vaccine confidence in the Philippines due to the Dengue vaccine issue. She also presented the specific methods on how the Immunization Campaign of the DOH is currently being implemented.

Aside from the nationwide vaccination, other key strategies to respond to the outbreak were tackled during the meeting. These include timely and accurate submission of surveillance measles reports, effective campaign materials, informative television commercials, and proper hospital care for the measles patients. In the implementation of these strategies, the participation of the

LGUs was highly encouraged by the Department.

After Asec. Vergeire's presentation, CHOs raised several concerns. One of which was the difficulty being experienced by employed parents when it comes to bringing their children in health centers because of work schedule. To settle this, it was agreed upon by the DOH and the Local Government Units (LGU) to have barangay health centers opened during weekends for vaccination.

To conclude the meeting, Sec. Duque imparted his closing remarks. "Ang pamahalaang lokal ay handang tumulong" says Sec. Duque, assuring everyone that the DOH will work hand in hand with other government agencies and LGUs to stop the measles outbreak.



### Helping heat drug addiction through TRH

As mandated by the Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002, "the state shall provide effective mechanism or measure to re-integrate into the society individuals who have fallen victim to drug abuse or dangerous drug dependence through sustainable programs of treatment and rehabilitation". Dr. Jose N. Rodriguez Memorial Hospital (DJNRMH) built a 2-story building "Tala Recovery Home" (TRH) to treat and rehabilitate people who fell victim to the risks of drugs. This was established through the initiative and support of the former Metro Manila Center for Health Development (MMCHD) Director Ariel Valencia and under the supervision of the Medical Center Chief of DJNRMH Alfonso Victorino H. Famaran.

In line with the "War on Drugs" campaign of President Rodrigo R. Duterte and in response to the sudden surge of people who voluntary seek rehabilitation from drugs, the TRH, one of the three pilot community-based of the MMCHD, was built. TRH is a "half-way home", a hybrid between an in-patient and an out-patient drug recovery facility, intended to provide psychosocial rehabilitation – combining the evidence-based Matrix-Intensive Out-Patient and the 12-Step Programs that includes: 1) Screening; 2) Structured group activities; 3) Tailor-fit treatment plan/care plan; 4) Individual counseling and / or psychotherapy; 5) Occupational therapy; 6) Drug testing; 7) Family education; 8) Relapse analysis; 9) Social support; 10) 12-step meetings; 11) Livelihood skills training; and 12) Referrals to people with "Mild" to "Moderate" level of severity of drug use, with no psychiatric comorbities and court cases. The individuals recovering from drug abuse will stay in the facility for a maximum period of three (3) months with gradual freedom to go home and look for a job.

Currently, the TRH is being furbished with beds and other needed supplies as the staff continue to capacitate themselves for this endeavor. Likewise, the TRH staff conducted orientation to DJNRMH employees, and provided information and educational materials for the program. This was headed by Dr. Maribel N. de Guzman together with the house manager, Mr. Ray Albert O. Lumawag, psychologist, Dr. Domingo R. Rayco, Jr., Ms. Alydia C. Soberano, Mr. Kevin D. Fonollera, Mr. Arthur Anthony C. Aves, Mr. Evan Charles Freo, Ms. Gailza Batoon, and Ms. Mae Ann Castenia.



## FIREWORKS-RELATED INJURIES IN METRO MANILA DOWN BY 50%

The Metro Manila Center for Health Development (MMCHD) reported a total of 123 fireworks-related injuries (FWRI) in the region during the recent holiday season, which is 50% (125 cases) less than the previous year. It is also notable that the total number of FWRI this year is 76% (323 cases) lower than the previous five-year average (2013-2017).

The use of fireworks and the type of firecracker involved in each injury was monitored with the help of the National Capital Region Police Office (NCRPO) during the FWRI Surveillance 2018 covering the period 21 December 2018 to 6 January 2019.

Of the recorded number of injuries in Metro Manila, 121 (98%) cases were due to fireworks and two (2%) to firework ingestion, and most (47, 38%) of these were from the City of Manila. The top three leading causes of FWRI in the region this year were Kwitis (32, 26%), Luces (19, 16%), and Pla-Pla (7, 9%).

The huge drop in FWRI is attributed to the different strategies that were conducted to intensify the OPLAN: Iwas Paputok Campaign. One of which that made an impact by reaching bigger population for greater public awareness was the several live TV/Radio guesting of Regional Director Corazon Flores and Assistant Regional Director Ma. Paz Corrales in Taumbahay of Net 25, News to Go of GMA News TV and four different programs of DZMM Teleradyo. The interviews gave emphasis on the information dissemination regarding EO 28 series of 2017 signed by President Rodrigo Duterte, and on the negative effects of using illegal firecrackers (scare tactics). It was also emphasized during the interview that to limit the use of firecrackers, a community fireworks display is highly encouraged in order to minimize the risk of injuries and casualties.

The MMCHD observed downward trend of fireworks-related incidents in Metro Manila from the previous years. Despite this, the agency will continue the OPLAN: Iwas Paputok Campaign which serves as a proactive measure in attaining a zero-injury holiday season.



# MMCHD celebrates Yosi Kadiri Day By Jireh Angelique Manaois

CITY of MANILA - In partnership with the World Health Organization (WHO) and Samahang Basketbol ng Pilipinas, the Metro Manila Center for Health Development (MMCHD) celebrated the World No Toabacco Day by conducting a basketball clinic on May 30, 2019 at Paco Arena. This basketball clinic was held to promote sports and to discourage the youth from smoking.

The event was attended by WHO Representative in the Philippines Dr. Gundo Aurel Weiler, athletes from Samahang Basketbol ng Pilipinas and Bataan Risers, and young participants from Manila City. Dr. Weiler opened the activity through his welcoming remarks where he stated the ill effects of tobacco. "Smoking damages your lungs, heart, brain and makes you prone to cancer", Dr. Weiler warned everyone.

Regional Director Dr. Flores informed the attendees about the harmful chemical substances cigarettes contain. Moreover, she reminded everyone that smoking affects not only the smokers themselves but also the people around them. "Bumalik sa ibang gawain tulad ng basketbol at pag-ehersisyo. Let's do activities that will take our breath away and at the same time, let's protect our lungs and the environment", Dr. Flores added.

One of the athletes, Mr. Jai Reyes, also delivered an inspirational message where he emphasized that refraining from smoking will lead to a happy and healthier lifestyle. He also told the young basketball aspirants that it is important to have a healthy body for one to be a successful sportsman. To conclude his speech, Mr. Reyes expressed his gratitude for having his team invited to advocate anti-smoking campaigns of the MMCHD.

After a short program, Coach Jong Uichico led the opening of the basketball clinic where all the attendees including the WHO and MMCHD staff had the chance to learn basic basketball techniques and skills. At the end of the activity, Yosi Kadri mascot entered the basketball court, representing the smokers and the harmful effects of tobacco.

Several anti-smoking campaigns are being promoted by the MMCHD not only during the World No Tobacco Day and most of these target the youth. The agency and the WHO believe that the children are the hope of the nation and thus, their health must be a priority. "We are here because we want to protect you. We want to ensure that you'll have a long and healthy life," said RD Dr. Flores.



### DOH hands over AMBULANCE TO LOUS

QUEZON CITY - The Department of Health-Central Office (DOH) turned ambulances over to different Local Government Units (LGUs) at the Philippine Blood Disease and Transfusion Center. Among the fortunate recipients were some LGUs of Metro Manila: 7 barangays of Marikina (Fortune, Nangka, Concepcion Dos, Concepcion Uno, Tumana, Parang), 6 barangays of Parañaque (Marcelo, Merville, Moonwalk, San Antonio, BF Homes, Don Bosco), Barangay Bagbag and Novaliches District Hospital of Quezon City, Muntinlupa City, 4 barangays of Malabon (Acacia, Potrero, Panghulo, Muzon), National Mental Hospital and Barangay Wackwack of Mandaluyong City. The DOH-Central Office, along with the Metro Manila Center for Health Development (MMCHD), facilitated the turning over event to ensure that health services such as emergency responses become available to all Filipinos.

The activity was attended by Dr. Corazon Flores, the MMCHD OIC-Regional Director, who participated in the inspection of ambulances to be donated. Dr. Melissa Sena, Medical Officer V of the DOH, conducted an orientation regarding the guidelines in licensure of ambulances before giving the vehicles to the recipients. The scope of the orientation revolved around the requirements that should be submitted by each recipient, as well as the corresponding responsibilities that each of them will take.

After the orientation, the barangay captains, drivers and health workers of LGU recipients were briefed and trained about the proper usage of medical devices incorporated in the ambulance, and about the operation of the medical vehicle itself. The training was then followed by the submission of requirements and inspection of each ambulance. After completing all the prerequisites, the ambulances were finally turned over to each respective LGU.

This turning over of ambulance to different local government units around the country marked another success for the DOH as it continues to fulfill its responsibility of extending technical assistance to LGUs - from the barangay to the city level.
