Foreword

For this year 2017, the Department of Health – National Capital Region Office (DOH – NCRO) continues to sustain its vision and mission to deliver quality health services for urban populace particularly aiming for the needs of the deprived and marginalized as evidenced in the Programs, Activities and Projects (PAP) planned and conducted by our region. We also make sure that all of these PAPs are aligned with the objectives of the PHA specifically to provide Better Health Outcomes for all, to promote health and to deliver healthcare through respect, value, and empower the clients with the health systems and to protect poor and vulnerable families against the high cost of healthcare. We are delighted that we have served over 291,263 poorest of the poor families provided with quality health services in collaboration with our retained Hospitals and other partner agencies. We have also deployed Human Resources for Health (Nurses, Midwives, Medical Technologist, Pharmacists and Public Health Associates) in the Health Centers to guarantee that all health-related concerns are immediately acted upon.

Notwithstanding the challenges of NCR, we the DOH – NCRO, still remains steadfast and resilient in order to deliver and improve the services for all Filipinos and with this Regional Profile, let me share with you, with pride and humility the successes and efforts of our region particularly aiming for a healthy Metro Manila.

Department of Health Philippine Health Agenda

Scope and Coverage

This issuance shall apply to the DOH central office bureaus and units, DOH regional offices; DOH hospitals (Specialty, Special, Retained, Sanitaria and Treatment and Rehabilitation Centers); Food and Drug Authority, DOH attached agencies such as: the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth), the Commission on Population (Popcom), the National Nutrition Council (NNC), Philippine National AIDS Council (PNAC) and the Philippine Institute of Traditional and Alternative Health Care (PITAHC); all public and private hospitals and health care facilities, health care providers and support staff; local government units (LGUs); other national government agencies (NGAs); development partners; civil society organizations; academic institutions; medical societies and organizations and all other institutions relevant for the implementation of the PHA.

Policy Framework

A. Goals: The PHA aims to (1) ensure the best health outcomes for all, without socio-economic, ethnic, gender, and geographic disparities; (2) promote health and deliver health care through means that respect, value, and empower clients and patients as they interact with the health system; and (3) protect all families especially the poor, marginalized, and vulnerable against the high costs of healthcare.

B. Values: All actions shall be implemented in accordance with the values of equity, quality, efficiency, transparency, accountability, sustainability, and resilience.

C. Guarantees: The health system shall guarantee:

1. Population- and individual-level interventions for all life stages that promotes health and wellness, prevent and treat the triple burden of disease, delay complications, facilitates rehabilitation, and provide palliation
2. Access to health interventions through functional Service Delivery Networks (SDN)
3. Financial freedom when accessing these interventions through Universal Health Insurance.

"All for Health, towards Health for All"

D. Strategies: The strategies need to fulfill the guarantees may be summarized by the word “**ACHIEVE.**”

1. Advance quality, health promotion, and primary care;
2. Cover all Filipinos against health-related financial risk;
3. Harness the power of strategic human resources for health development;
4. Invest in eHealth and data for decision-making;
5. Enforce standards, accountability, and transparency;
6. Value All Clients and patients, especially the poor, marginalized, and
7. Elicit multi-sectoral and multi-stakeholder support for health.

General Guidelines

A. All DOH offices, units, hospitals, and attached agencies shall align their policies, programs, and activities to the PHA. They shall advocate for the PHA to all stakeholders and partners.

B. All national government agencies/entities with funds and activities related to health, such as but not limited to the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS), Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO), Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR), Philippine General Hospital (PGH), Hospitals of State Universities and Colleges (SUCs), Department of Education (DepEd), Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), agencies under the Housing and Urban Development Coordinating Council (HUDCC), and Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), are strongly encouraged to align their policies, programs, and funds for health with the PHA.

C. The following essential policy documents shall be formulated by the DOH, upon issuance of the Order, to supplement the PHA:

1. Implementation Plan and Operational Guidelines which shall describe the management arrangements to facilitate implementation, monitoring and evaluation, including accountabilities of all DOH offices, attached agencies and stakeholders.
2. National Objectives for Health 2016–2022 which will identify priorities and provide a compendium of indicators, corresponding targets and data sources that shall be used to track performance of the health sector.
3. Health Research Agenda which shall provide focus and direction on health research and development efforts and serve as basis for allocation of grants.

4. PHA Monitoring & Evaluation System which shall outline the logical framework, and monitoring and evaluation plan for the PHA consisting of but not limited to indicators, targets, sources of data, collection mechanisms, and reports to track health sector and DOH performance.

5. Ambisyon for Health 2040 which shall situate the PHA in the long term and provide strategic direction for the health sector in line with Ambisyon 2040.

Specific Guidelines for Realizing the Guarantees

To realize the 3 Guarantees of the PHA, the DOH and its attached agencies shall develop, policies, plans, and programs in support of ACHIEVE.

A. Advance Quality, Health Promotion and Primary Care

1. DOH shall require health providers to conduct annual health visits for all poor families, marginalized, vulnerable and special populations (eg. DSWD Listahanan-identified poor, Indigenous Peoples, Persons with Disabilities, Senior Citizens)
2. DOH shall develop an explicit list of primary care entitlements, along with clinical practice guidelines, that will become the basis for licensing/accreditation standards, contracting arrangements for PCNs, and benefit expansion of Philippine Health Insurance Corporation.
3. DOH shall transform select DOH hospitals in Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao into mega-hospitals or hospitals with multi-specialty training capabilities and reference laboratory.
4. DOH shall support LGUs in advancing local health policies (resolutions or ordinances) that improve access to lifesaving interventions and reduce exposure to risk factors for premature death and disability (e.g. city-wide smoke-free or speed limit ordinances)
5. DOH shall establish expert bodies for health promotion, surveillance, and response.

B. Cover all Filipinos against Health –related Financial Risk

1. DOH, PhilHealth, other NGAs, all LGUs, and all other concerned shall collectively work for revenue generating measures, such as but not limited to, further increasing excise taxes for tobacco and alcohol, imposing taxes, increasing NHIP premium rates, and improving collection efficiency from the public and private formal sector.
2. DOH and PhilHealth shall lead in aligning all health financial programs (GSIS, MAP, PCSO, PAGCOR) to support Universal health insurance.
3. PhilHealth shall expand benefits of NHIP to cover outpatient diagnostics, medicines, and blood and blood products, as guided by health technology assessment.
4. PhilHealth shall review and update costing of current case rates to ensure that they cover the full cost of care and that they link payment to quality of service rendered.



5. Philhealth shall enhance and enforce its contracting policies (e.g. setting up of primary care trust funds, network based contracting, income retention for LGUs health providers with retained budget support incentives)

C. Harness the Power of Strategic Human Resources for Health (HRH) Development

1. The DOH, in coordination with the HRH Network shall review and revise the curriculum of health professionals to make it more primary care-oriented and responsive to local and global needs.
2. It shall review and streamline HRH compensation packages, including financial and non-financial incentives for those serving in high-risk or geographically-isolated and disadvantaged areas (GIDA), and support the full implementation of Magna Carta for Health Care Workers.
3. It shall update frontline staffing complement standards from profession-based to competency-based
4. It shall make available fully-funded scholarships for HRH hailing from GIDA areas or IP groups
5. It shall formulate mechanisms for mandatory return of service schemes for all health graduates.

D. Invest in eHealth and Data for Decision Making

1. The DOH and PhilHealth shall mandate the use of electronic medical records in all health facilities
2. The DOH, PhilHealth, FDA shall make online submission of clinical, drug dispensing, and administrative and financial records as prerequisite for registration, licensing and contracting
3. The DOH, PhilHealth, FDA shall commission nationwide surveys to supplement unavailable or incomplete administrative data, streamline information systems and administrative data collections systems, and support efforts to improve local civil registration and vital statistics

E. Enforce Standards, Accountability, and Transparency

1. The DOH shall initiate publication of health information that can trigger better performance and accountability (e.g. prices of common drugs and services, non-compliant/erring providers, national objectives for health targets, and various health scorecards)

2. The DOH shall set up a dedicated performance monitoring unit that will employ appropriate mechanisms to track performance or progress of reforms, including but not limited to medical audits and third-party monitoring.

F. Value All Clients and Patients, especially the poor and vulnerable

1. The DOH shall ensure that the poorest 20 million Filipinos are prioritized in all health programs and supported in non-direct health expenditures (e.g. transportation subsidy)
2. The DOH in coordination with other partners and stakeholders shall make all health entitlements simple, explicit, and widely published to facilitate understanding.
3. The DOH shall set up participation and redress mechanisms.
4. The DOH and its attached agencies shall reduce turnaround time and improve transparency of processes at all DOH offices and health facilities.
5. All health care facilities shall eliminate queuing and guarantee decent accommodation and clean restrooms in all government hospitals

G. Elicit Multi-sectoral and Multi-stakeholder Support for health

1. DOH and PhilHealth shall harness and align the private sector in planning supply-side investments, forming SDNs, and expanding PhilHealth contracting to immediately include the private sector (e.g. Z & primary care benefits)
2. DOH shall ensure convergence and develop a health policy agenda with other NGAs (DILG, DENR, DSWD, DepEd, HUDCC, among others) addressing social determinants through Health in All Policies and other multi-sectoral approaches
3. DOH shall require health impact assessment and a corresponding public health management plan as a prerequisite for initiating large-scale, high-risk development projects in the areas of mining, power plants, oil rigs, etc.
4. DOH shall foster collaboration and partnership with CSOs and other stakeholders on budget development, and monitoring and evaluation.





Department of Health Philippine Health Agenda

A. Geographic and Demographic Profile

Metro Manila, otherwise known as National Capital Region, the prime region of the Philippines. NCR does not have any provinces, different from among other regions. It is composed of sixteen (16) highly urbanized cities namely: Manila, Quezon City, Caloocan, Pasay, Malabon, Navotas, Valenzuela, Marikina, Pasig, Taguig, Makati, Mandaluyong, San Juan, Las Piñas, Muntinlupa, and Parañaque and one (1) urban municipality - Pateros.

Metro Manila has a total land area of 650.7 square kilometers and it occupies approximately 0.21% of the entire Philippines. It comprises 32 congressional districts and 1,706 barangays. It is bounded on the north by the Province of Bulacan, on its southern side by the Provinces of Laguna and Cavite, Manila Bay on the western side and the Province of Rizal on the east.

Because of its advantageous location, Metro Manila has been the center of political, economic and social activities. Thus, most of the major industries, cultural and educational facilities, relatively well-developed transportation and communication systems as well as other basic services are situated in this region.

Metro Manila lies entirely within the tropics and because of its proximity to the equator, the temperature range is very small. It has a distinct, relatively short dry season from January to April and long wet season from May through December.

B. Milestones of Activities/Accomplishments of the National Capital Regional Office

1. *Health Outreach for People Empowerment (HOPE) Caravan*

As mandated by Philippine Health Agenda under President Duterte's administration, the DOH-NCRO conducted a series of Health Outreach Program for People Empowerment (HOPE) Caravan, throughout different districts of the National Capital Region. The HOPE Caravan is considered as the first of many activities conducted for health promotion during the current leadership.

Aiming to increase access of citizens to health services and accomplish better health awareness, the DOH-NCRO was overwhelmed with the active involvement and positive feedback from partners and other stakeholders that a total of 90 HOPE Caravans were conducted and an aggregate number of 291,263 poorest of the poor were reached for CY 2017.

2. *Type ng Bayan*

The Type ng Bayan," a national blood typing initiative aimed to determine blood type information of Filipino citizens nationwide with Metro Manila as initial pilot site. The said program aims to consolidate information on the blood type of all Metro Manila residents, allowing the region to establish a blood type database that will enable the same to identify and match with possible donors, and provide fresh and readily accessible blood for those in need of transfusions such as outbreak of diseases like dengue.

3. *BHW Convention – “A tribute for the Unsung Heroes”*

Now on its second year, the DOH- NCRO gathered once again the “unsung heroes” of our health delivery system



through a program that recognized their immeasurable efforts and awarded exceptional BHWs in NCR as well as those in service for more than 30 years.

The celebration also included thorough discussions on pertinent health topics that could serve as useful information for BHWs in rendering health services and providing updated information to the community, such as the Philippine Health Agenda, E.O. 51 Milk Code and a briefer on EO 26 Establishment of Smoke-Free Environments.

Finally, the ceremony was concluded by distributing vests, bags, umbrellas and identification cards which could serve as tokens for BHWs in rendering quality health services to the community.

C. Health Resources

Health Facilities

In 2017, Metro Manila has a total number of 476 health centers representing a health facility population ratio of 1:27,141, which is below the standard ratio of 1:20,000 population. Quezon City (65) and Manila (59) have the most number of health centers among other LGUs but are still not enough to meet the ideal proportion to population. Only Malabon, Valenzuela, Pasig, Pateros, Mandaluyong, San Juan, and Las Piñas were able to meet the national standard ratio.

Moreover, a total of 52 lying-in clinics and 32 barangay health stations are all over the region where BHS are located in San Juan, Caloocan City, Quezon City, Valenzuela, Manila, Muntinlupa, Paranaque, Valenzuela and Navotas.

The National Capital Region has 162 licensed hospitals with a total bed capacity of 29,890, representing a bed to population ratio of 1:432. Of the total, 114 or 70% are managed and operated by private organizations and 48 or 30% are government owned and controlled hospitals. Of the 48 government hospitals, 20 are under the DOH (retained), 20 are administered by the LGUs and 8 are ran by other national government agencies.

In terms of level of health care in both government and private, 69 (43%) are in primary care, 37 (23%) secondary care and 56 (34%) in tertiary level of care which are mostly found in Quezon City and Manila.

Health Manpower

As of December 2017, the National Capital Region has 642 Physicians (1:20,123), 501 Dentists (1:25.786), 1,014 Nurses (1:12,741), 1,193 Midwives (1:10,829) 101 Nutritionists (1:127,911), 259 Medical Technologists (1:49,880) and 282 Sanitary Inspectors (1:45,812) assigned in the LGUs. Only Dentists, Nurses, and Medical Technologists were able to meet the standard ratios.







Figure 4a. DIRECT CAUSE




Figure 4b. INDIRECT CAUSE




Figure 4c. OTHER CAUSE

NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017**




**Figure 7: INFANT MORTALITY RATE

NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017**




**Figure 9: UNDER FIVE MORTALITY RATE

NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017**






Figure 13: SKILLED BIRTH ATTENDANT and FACILITY-BASED DELIVERY NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2013-2017

Figure 14: SKILLED BURTH ATTENDANT by CITY/MUNICIPALITY and NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 15: DACILITY-BASED DELIVERY by CITY/ MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 16: LIVEBIRTHS by BIRTHWEIGHT and ATTENDANCE & DELIVERIES by PLACE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017

Fig. 16a: Livebirths by Birthweight




Fig. 16b: Livebirths by Attendance





Fig. 16c: Deliveries by Place





Figure 18: PREGNANT WOMEN GIVEN COMPLETE IRON with FOLIC ACID SUPPLEMENTATION by CITY/MUNICIPALITY and NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017






Figure 20: POSTPARTUM WOMEN with AT LEAST 2 PP VISITS and PP WOMEN WHO HAD INITIATED BREASTFEEDING by CITY/MUNICIPALITY NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017


Figure 21: POSTPARTUM WOMEN GIVEN COMPLETE IRON AND NATIONAL SUPPLEMENTATION by CITY/MUNICIPALITY AND VITAMIN A SUPPLEMENTATION, 2017




**Figure 22: CONTRACEPTIVE PREVALENCE RATE
NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2013-2017**




**Figure 23: CONTRACEPTIVE PREVALENCE RATE by




Figure 28: INFANTS EXCLUSIVELY BREASTFED UNTIL 6TH MONTH NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2013-2017




Figure 29: EXCLUSIVELY BF UNTIL 6TH MONTH by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 30: INFANTS 6-11 MONTHS OLD GIVEN VITAMIN A SUPPLEMENTATION by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 31: CHILDREN 12-59 MONTHS OLD GIVEN VITAMIN A SUPPLEMENTATION by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 33: CHILDREN 12-53 MONTHS OLD RECEIVED MICRONUTRIENT POWDER by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 35: CHILDREN 12-59 MONTHS OLD GIVEN IRON SUPPLEMENTATION by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017






Figure 36: CHILDREN 12-59 MONTHS OLD GIVEN DEWORMING TABLET/SYRUP by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017





Figure 38: SICK CHILDREN 12-59 MONTHS OLD SEEN and GIVEN VITAMIN A SUPPLEMENTATION by CITY/ MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017






Figure 39: INFANTS with LOW BIRTH WEIGHT SEEN and GIVEN IRON SUPPLEMENTATION by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 43: PNEUMONIA CASES 0-59 MONTHS OLD CHILDREN SEEN and GIVEN COMPLETE TREATMENT by CITY/ MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 44: TB TREATMENT SUCCESS RATE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 45: TB TREATMENT SUCCESS RATE by CITY/ MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017






Figure 46: TB MORBIDITY AND MORTALITY RATES NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2013-2017




Figure 48: CHILDREN 12-71 MONTHS PROVIDED with BASIC ORAL HEALTH CARE by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 49: ADOLESCENT and YOUTH 10-24 YEARS OLD PROVIDED with BASIC ORAL HEALTH CARE by CITY/MUNICIPALITY NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 50: PREGNANT WOMEN PROVIDED with BASIC ORAL HEALTH CARE by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 51: OLDER PERSONS 60 YEARS OLD and ABOVE PROVIDED with BASIC ORAL HEALTH CARE by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017




Figure 52: % of HOUSEHOLDS with ACCESS TO SAFE WATER SUPPLY NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2013-2017




Figure 53: % of HOUSEHOLDS with ACCESS TO SAFE WATER SUPPLY by CITY/MUNICIPALITY NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2013-2017




Figure 54: % of HOUSEHOLDS with SANITARY TOILET NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2013-2017




Figure 55: % of HOUSEHOLDS with SANITARY TOILET by CITY/MUNICIPALITY NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2013-2017




Figure 57: FOOD ESTABLISHMENT with SANITARY PERMIT by CITY/MUNICIPALITY & NCR NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION, 2017


